We have some **URGENT** news we need ALL our members to take action on. NH HB1178 is ready to go to the Governor for his signature. This is one of the strongest legislative actions New Hampshire has seen putting OUR Second Amendment rights in an untouchable place from Federal overreaching laws and executive orders. The bill has passed in the House and Senate and now just needs the Governor's signature. This bill prevents the Feds from touching these rights. "Prohibiting the state from enforcing any federal statute, regulation, or Presidential Executive Order that restricts or regulates the right of the people to keep and bear arms."
