

New ATF Pistol Brace Ruling

Summary of Change

The final rule's definition of "rifle" states clearly that the term "designed, redesignated, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder" includes a weapon that is equipped with an accessory, component, or other rearward attachment (e.g., a stabalizing brace), that provides surface area that allows the weapon to be fired from the shoulder, provided other factors (as described in the rule) indicate the weapon is designed, made, and intended to be fired from the shoulder.

Effective Date of Final Rule

The final rule was signed by the Attorney General on January 13, 2023 and was subsequently published in the Federal Register on January 31, 2023.

The Final Rule is effective on January 31, 2023.

The compliance date is 120 days from the date of publication, which is May 31, 2023.

Violation of this ruling can result in a felony charge with up to 10 years in jail and a \$10,000 fine!!

New ATF Pistol Brace Ruling (cont.)

Options Available to all Possessors

- 1. Remove the short barrel and attach a 16-inch or longer rifle barrel to the firearm.
- 2. Permanently remove and dispose of, or alter the "stabilizing brace" such that it cannot be reattached.
- 3. Turn the firearm into your local ATF office.
- 4. Destroy the firearm.
- 5. Register the weapon as set forth below, depending on your category of possessor.
