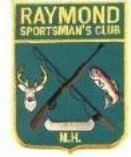

New Raymond Sportsman's Club Rule

Too often in 2023 a member has reported losing their club key. The club key is the property of the RSC and is only loaned out to the members, when they join or renew their membership. Effective January 1st, 2024, any member who loses their club key, 1st time, will pay the treasurer ten dollars (\$10) for a replacement. Also, if that member loses their club key a second time, they will be in violation of the club Bylaws (ARTICLE V, Section 5. a. & b.). The Ways and Means Committee will determine the necessary disciplinary action needed. Any RSC member caught loaning out their club key to a non-member or caught duplicating their key will be in violation of the RSC Bylaws (Article V, Section 5 a. & b.) The Ways and Means Committee will determine the necessary actions needed to deal with the situation.

Attention to All RSC Members

This is the second notification to all members that membership renewal will be conducted the whole month of April 2024. Each member who wishes to stay a member of the RSC must renew their membership no later than April 30th. Members will be required to sign a new **Waiver and Release of Liability Form**, when renewing their membership. Members can renew their membership at the clubhouse before and after the April meetings. The treasurer will also set aside two Saturdays in April for members to pay their dues. This will also take place at the clubhouse. Any and all members who do not renew their membership by April 30th will be dropped from the club roster. Those individuals can resubmit their application to rejoin the RSC, but their names will go to the bottom of the waiting list. FYI, the waiting time to rejoin is a year and a half or more.

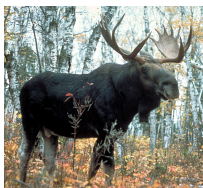
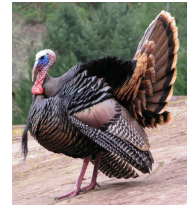
RSC 2024 Game Dinner
