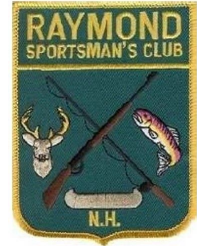
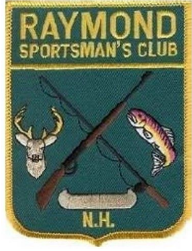

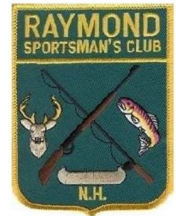

RSC Private Chartered Deep Sea Fishing Trip



The RSC fishing trip is set for August 30th, with participants required to arrive at Eastman's Docks in Seabrook Beach, NH, by 6:30 a.m. We will be aboard the Lady Virginia II, a 65-foot DMR available for private charters, which features both indoor booth seating and outdoor bench seating, accommodating up to 40 passengers comfortably. The cost of the trip is \$75 per person, nonrefundable unless canceled by Eastman's due to weather conditions. The maximum capacity is set at 30 individuals, with 7 spots currently available. Rods and reels can be rented for an additional fee of \$8 each. Onboard, a snack bar will provide refreshments, including sodas, candies, crackers, and chips, as well as Bud and Bud Light for those wishing to enjoy a beer while fishing. Participants can also visit the Tuna Striker Pub for a seafood dinner before heading home. Attendees are encouraged to dress warmly, wear comfortable rubber-soled shoes, and bring any preferred food and non-alcoholic beverages.
